- * The warranty is voided with the use of any non- Minka-Aire® electrical devices, E.g., wall controls or electrical dimmer switches, etc...
- * The warranty is void once the original purchaser or user ceases to own the fan or the fan is moved from its original point of installation.
- * The warranty is void with the use of any hanger bracket (non-Minka Aire or non-fan specific) other than the hanger bracket supplied & installed with this specific fan.

Warranty Service Information

To obtain warranty servic during the warranty period, the purchaser should return the fan with the sales receipt to the original place of purchase. The authorized Minka-Aire®dealer, at its sole discretion, will either repair or replace the fan after verifying the legitimacy of the warranty claim. Replacement is subject to availability of the same model. If the model is unavailable it will be replaced by one of equal value. This is a limited warranty; The original purchaser or user is responsible for the cost of removal and reinstallation of repaired or replacement product.

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FINISHING THE INSTALLATION





1) SAFETY FIRST

- 1. Before you begin installing the fan, shut power off at the circuit breaker of the fuse box.
- 2.Be cautious! Read all instructions and safety information before installing your new fan. Review accompanying assembly diagrams.3. Make sure that all electrical connections comply with local codes, ordinances, or National Electrical Codes.
- Hire a qualified electrician or consult a do-it-yourself wiring handbook if you are unfamiliar with installing electrical wiring.

 4. Make sure the installation site you choose allows the fan blades to rotate without any obstructions. Allow a minimum clearance of 7 feet from the floor and 18 inches from the tip of the blades to the wall.
- 5. NOTE: THIS CEILING FROM EXCEEDS THE MAXIMUM WEIGHT SPECIFIED BY UL FOR HANGING FROM A STANDARD OUTLET BOX. SPECIAL
- REINFORCEMENT OF THE CEILING IS REQUIRED FOR INSTALLATION.

 6. CAUTION: Use the wood screws provided for fan installation. The wood screws must go through the outlet box via the knock outs and secured directly to the building joist.
- 7. After you install the fan, make sure that all mounting components are secured to prevent the fan from falling.
- 8. Do not insert anything into the fan blades while the fan is operating.
- 9. Turn the fan off and wait for the blades to stop completely before cleaning or performing any maintenance.

It must be understood that common sense, caution and care are factors which can not be built into this product. 

MOUNTING OPTIONS

If there isn't an existing mounting box, then read the following instructions. Disconnect the power by removing fuses or turning off circuit breakers.


Secure the outlet box directly to the building structure. Use appropriate fasteners and building materials. The outlet box and its support must be able to fully support the moving weight of the fan (at least 50 lbs.). Use a UL Listed metal outlet box. Do not use a plastic outlet box.


Figure 1, 2 and 3 are examples of different ways to mount the outlet box.


Note: You may need a longer downrod to maintain proper blade clearance when installing on a steep, sloped ceiling. Longer downrods are available from your Restoration Hardware dealer.


To hang your fan where there is an existing fixture but no ceiling joist, you may need to install a hanger bar as shown in Fig. 4 (available at your Restoration Hardware dealer).

INSTALLING THE FAN









HANGING THE FAN

WARNING: All of the parts, hardware and components such as the hanger bracket and hanger ball have been provided for your safety and the proper installation of your new ceiling fan. The use of other parts hardware or components not supplied by Minka Aire® with the fan will void the Minka Aire® Warranty.

REMEMBER to turn off the power. Follow the steps below to hang your fan properly;

Step 1. Remove two knock-outs from the outlet box to expose the joist. (Fig. 5)


Step 2. Use the two wood screws and washers to secure the hanger bracket plate directly to the building joist via the knock-out holes from the outlet box. (Fig. 6)


CAUTION! THE HANGER BRACKET PLATE MUST BE INSTALLED DIRECTLY TO THE BUILDING JOIST USING THE TWO WOOD SCREWS AND WASHERS PROVIDED. Step 3. Secure hanger bracket to hanger bracket plate using the two hex nuts and washers provided, make sure nuts are securely tighten. (Fig. 7) Step 4. Loosen the two Set Screws from the coupling. (Fig. 8)


Step 5. Remove the Hanger Ball from the Down Downrod Assembly by loosening the Set Screw and removing the Cross

(Fig. 9) Step 6. Unfold the decorative scroll arms and space them evenly. Secure assembly by tightening the nut with the wrench

provided. (Fig. 10)






Step 7. Carefully feed fan wires up through the downrod. (Fig. 11) Thread Downrod into the Coupling until the holes are lined up and secure with the Lock Pin and Hitch Pin previously removed, tighten Set Screws. (Fig. 11)


Step 8. Slip Coupling Cover, Decorative scroll, Canopy Cover and Canopy onto Downrod. Carefully re-install the Hanger Ball onto the Downrod

being sure that it's properly positioned over the Cross Pin and the wires

are not twisted, tighten Set Screw. (Fig. 11)

Step 9. Lift the Motor Assembly and place the Hanger Ball into the Hanger Bracket. Rotate the Motor Assembly as needed until the check groove from the Hanger Ball rests firmly over the registration tab from the Hanger Bracket. Motor Assembly should not rotate if this is done correctly. (Fig. 12)





ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS

WARNING:To avoid possible electrical shock be sure electricity is turned off at the main fuse or breaker box before wiring.

Note: The Aire Control[®] System is equipped with a learning frequency function which has 256 code cominations to prevent potential interference

from other remote units. The frequency on your Receiver and Transmitter units have been preset at the factory. (Fig. 13). No frequency change is necessary, should you desire to install another fan within the same home or area with a seperate frequency code please see the "frequency interference" troubleshooting section of this instruction manual to learn how to change the frequency.

Step 1. Insert Receiver into Hanger Bracket with the flat side of the

Step 2.Motor to Receiver Electrical Connections: Connect the WHITE wire from the fan to the WHITE wire $\,$ marked "TO MOTOR N" from the

Receiver facing the ceiling. (Fig. 14)

Receiver. Connect the BLACK wire from the fan to the BLACK wire marked "TO MOTOR L" from the Receiver. Connect the BLUE wire from the fan to the BLUE wire marked "For Light" from the Receiver.


(Fig. 15 & 16)

Note: If your ceiling fan features an UP Light: Connect the ORANGE wire from the fan to the ORANGE wire marked "For Up Light" from the Receiver. Otherwise disregard this step and proceed to secure all wire connections with the plastic wire nuts provided. (Fig. 15 & 16)


Step 3. Receiver to House Supply Wires Electrical Connections: Connect the WHITE wire (Neutral) from the outlet box to the WHITE wire marked "AC in N" from the receiver. Connect the BLACK wire (Hot) from the outlet box to the BLACK wire marked "AC in L" from the receiver. Secure all wire connections with the plastic wire nuts provided. (Fig. 15 & 16)


Step 4.If your outlet box has a GROUND wire (Green or Bare Copper) connect this wire to the Hanger Ball and Hanger Bracket Ground wires. If your outlet box does not have a Ground Wire, then connect the Hanger Ball and Hanger Bracket Ground Wires together. Secure wire connection with the plastic wire nut provided.


After all splices are made, check to make sure there are no loose strands. As an additional precaution we suggest to secure the plastic wire connectors to the wires with electrical tape. Note: Fan must be installed from a maximum distance

of 40 feet from the transmitting unit for proper signal transmission between the transmitting unit and the fan's receiving unit.









INSTALLING THE WALL TRANSMITTER

WARNING! HOOK UP "IN SERIES" ONLY. DO NOT CONNECT NEUTRAL SUPPLY WIRE OF ELECTRIC CIRCUIT TO THE TRANSMITTER WALL SWITCH, DAMAGE TO THE TRANSMITTER WALL SWITCH AND POSSIBLE FIRE COULD OCCUR.

Step 1. Remove the existing wall plate and switch from the wall outlet box.

Step 2. Make the electrical connections as shown in Fig.16. If your outlet box has a ground wire (Green or Bare Copper) connect the Transmitter's ground wire directly to one of the screws from the outlet box. Secure all wire connections with the plastic wire nuts provided.

Step 3. Carefully tuck the wire connections inside the outlet box. The Touch ControlTM System provided with your fan includes two sets of face and decorative plate color options. The wall control comes with a standard white faceplate attached. If you desire to replace it with the Ivory color faceplate, use your fingernail or a small flat screwdriver and gently pry it apart from the top or bottom of the plate. Use the screws provided to secure the wall transmitter and wall plate to the outlet box. (Fig. 17)




FINISHING THE INSTALLATION

Step 1. Remove 1 of the 2 screws from the bottom of the hanger bracket and loosen the other one half a turn from the screw head.

Step 2. Slide the canopy up towards the hanger bracket and place the key hole on the canopy over the screw on the hanger bracket, turn canopy until it locks in place at the narrow section of the key holes. (Fig. 18)

Step 3. Align the circular hole on canopy with the remaining hole on the hanger bracket, secure by tightening the two set screws.

Note: Adjust the canopy screws as necessary until the canopy and canopy cover are snug.




ATTACHING THE BLADES


THE FOLLOWING OPERATION MUST BE ACCOMPLISHED BEFORE INSTALLING THE LIGHT KIT.

Step 1. Attach the fan blades to the blade holders using the screws & fiber washers provided. (Fig 19).

Step 2. Align holes from blade holder to motor and secure with 2 screws provided. (Fig 20).

All blade sets are grouped by weight. Because natural woods vary in density, the fan may wobble even though the blades are weight matched. The following procedure should correct most fan wobble. Check after each step.





INSTALLING THE LIGHT KIT & GLASS SHADE

Step 1. Remove 3 screws from light kit plate. (Fig. 21)


Step 2. Plug the 2 wires from the fan to the two wires from the light kit. (Fig. 22)


Step 3. Secure tighten the 3 removed screws back to assemble the light kit onto the light kit plate. Then, remove the finial, nut and washers from the light kit. (Fig 23)

Step 4. Assemble the glass, tighten back the washers, nut and finial to fix the glass. (Fig 24)









OPERATING THE REMOTE CONTROL/WALL CONTROL

Remote Control fans only: Install the A23, 12v battery (included). To prevent damage to transmitter remove the battery if not used for long periods of time.

A. • • • Buttons:

These buttons are used to set the fan speeds as follows:

= Low Speed= Medium Speed= High Speed

B. ■Button:

This button turns the fan off.

C. Button:

These buttons turn the light ON or OFF and also

control the brightness settings of the light. The following instructions apply to ceiling fans that feature a DOWN light (& button) only or ceiling fans that feature an UP light (& button) and a DOWN light (& button) that are controlled independent of each other;

Press and release the button for the desired light to turn the light ON or OFF. Press and hold the button to set the desired light brightness. The light will cycle between bright and dim settings as long as the button is pressed.

The light key has an automatic auto-resume

feature that allows the light to remain at the same brightness as the last time it was turned off.

D. OFF-ON Slide Button (Wall Control Fans Only) This button turns the power Off and On to the Fan and Light(s).

E. Button: (Full Function Remote Control Units Only) This button is used to change the direction of the rotation of the blades; forward for warm weather or reverse for warm weather.


NOTE: If your Remote Control or Wall Control does not have a "REV" button, Please look for a slide reverse switch on the motor housing.


Speed settings for warm or cold weather depend on factors such as room size, ceiling height and number of fans.

NOTE: To change the direction of the rotation of the blades the fan must be in operation mode.

Warm Weather (forward)
A DOWNWARD airflow creates a cooling effect as shown in Figure 25. This allows you to set your air conditioner on a warmer setting without affecting your comfort.

Cool Weather (Reverse)
An UPWARD airflow moves warmer air off the ceiling area as shown in Figure 26. This allows you to set your heating unit on a cooler setting without affecting your comfort.





CARE OF YOUR FAN

Here are some suggestions to help maintain your fan.

- 1. Because of the fan's natural movement some connections may become loose. Check the support connections, brackets and blade attachments twice a year. Make sure they are secure. (It is not necessary to remove
- 2. Clean your fan periodically to help maintain its new appearance over the years. Use only a soft brush or lint free cloth to avoid scratching the finish. Plated finishes are sealed with lacquer to minimize discoloration or tarnishing. Do not use water when cleaning, this could damage the motor, wood blades or possibly cause an electrical shock.
- 3. If your fan is provided with wood veneer blades; you can apply a light coat of furniture polish for additional protection and enhanced beauty. Cover small scratches with a light application of shoe polish.
- 4. Use a lint free lightly damp cloth or duster to remove dust from the

blades.

- 5. There is no need to oil your fan. The motor has permanently lubricated bearings.
- 6. If your fan is provided with glass shades, clean with lukewarm soapy water and a soft cloth or sponge. DO NOT IMMERSE GLASS SHADES IN HOT WATER. DO NOT PUT GLASS SHADES INTO AN AUTOMATIC DISHWASHER.


